Dear Parents and Carers,

After listening to your feedback regarding recording your child's reading at home, we have made the decision to bring back paper reading records. From the survey that was sent out last week, over 85% of you who responded said that you would prefer a paper reading record and so we actioned this straight away and today all children from Reception to year 6 will bring home a reading record along with their reading book.



Expectations

Children are expected to read at home every night and to ask an adult to record their reading in their reading record. Older children can record their own reading, if they wish, and ask an adult to sign their reading record to say that they have seen or heard them reading at home. Children will need to have their reading book and their reading record in school with them every day.

Reading Rewards

When a child has recorded that they have read three times at home, they will then receive a stamp on their Reading Worm. Once they have collected 12 stamps, they will then receive a special token to select a free book from one of our wonderful vending machines. Once a child has completed two Reading Worms, they will then be able to select a reading buddy to take home with them. The more times children read, then the more rewards they will receive.
