It is important for the children to be ready to line up on the playground with their class as this promotes a positive start to the day ahead and they are ready to learn.

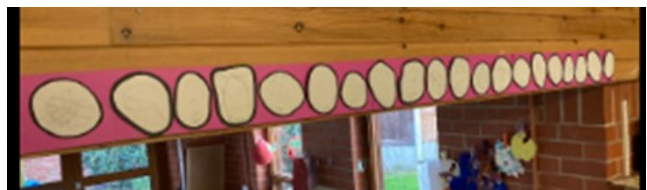
**We have had a great start back to the term, let's keep it up!**

Chocolate Crunch/Fruit/Choice of Yoghurt

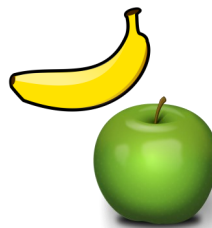

Year 6 sell fruit at break times for 20p.

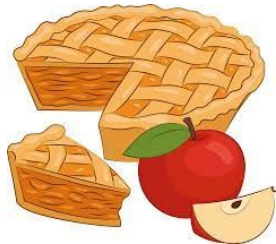
